We are thrilled to host Dr. Ann Rondeau, President of College of DuPage since July, 2016, as our speaker for our **October 10** meeting (Please note the date which is the second Wednesday of October.). She is a past president of the National Defense University, a consortium of five colleges and nine research centers in Washington, DC.

Dr. Rondeau retired from the U.S. Navy as a three-star Admiral in 2012 (the second woman to have achieved this rank in the Navy). She has served as a partner and independent consultant with the IBM Watson Group. She was selected and served as a White House Fellow in the Reagan Administration.

Dr. Rondeau holds a BA from Eisenhower College (NY), an MA from Georgetown University (DC), and an EdD from Northern Illinois University. She holds an honorary Doctorate in Public Service from Carthage College and an honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters from Rosalind Franklin University of Medicine and Science.

Rondeau has extensive leadership experience in significant military and educational roles. These include Pentagon Director/Chief of Staff for the U.S. Navy Staff; Commander of the Naval Service Training Command at Great Lakes, Illinois; Commanding Officer of Naval Support Activity, Pacific Fleet Chief of Staff in Hawaii; and Commander of the Navy Personnel Development Command in Virginia.

Rondeau serves as a board member on a variety of organizations, which include the Naval Postgraduate School Board of Advisors, the Dwight D. Eisenhower Memorial Commission, the Chicago Regional Growth Corporation Board, the Council for Higher Education Accreditation, the National Museum of the Sailor Foundation Board of Directors, the Military Advisory Board, the Executive Board of US Navy *Education for Seapower Study* and the Choose DuPage Board of Directors.

Post-September Meeting Survey Results

Many of you have asked about the results of the Showcase Meeting on September 8. We were interested as well, since this was a very different format for our Branch.

First, we found the results surprising. Of the 67 respondents (thank you for taking the time to complete the survey), 26 attended the meeting (actual attendance was 46), and 41 had not attended.

- The large majority of non-attendees (89.6%) said that they had another commitment that day.
- Another 10.34% reported no interest in this topic.

Among attendees:

- 77.78% said the meeting exceeded expectations.
- The remainder said the meeting met expectations.
- No one reported that the meeting did not meet expectations.

We asked attendees to rate the five round table discussions:

- For 4 out of 5 discussions, more than 50% of attendees rated them exceeding expectations. One topic was rated at 47.83%.
- Otherwise, all discussions were rated as meeting expectations.

Thank you to our presenters for their efforts and preparation in making this new format a success.

Springfield Update: You can find the list of bills passed by both chambers of the Illinois General Assembly in spring 2018 by going to <http://www.ilga.gov/commission/lru/Aug2018FirstRdg.pdf> (Some have been vetoed since this publication.) As Twigs goes to press, Governor Rauner has taken no action on HB4163 (pay equity). If he vetoes that bill, AAUW-IL lobbyist, Jenni Purdue, predicts a veto override effort in November.
