100K for Equal Pay! AAUW Members are Called to Action!

You are already probably aware of AAUW's national focus on economic security for women. Our strategic plan sets the goal of pay equity by 2030. This will be accomplished by championing pay equity legislation federally and, in all states, and by leading the nation in providing salary negotiation programs for employees and employers.

We know that our membership supports this effort and is willing to act in support of these goals. That is why our national leaders are asking that we ALL become involved. As a first step, please register for Work Smart Online at *AAUW.org*. This is our new, free course that teaches women salary negotiation skills. Even if the curriculum doesn't seem directly relevant to you, we need all members to familiarize themselves with the material and become ambassadors in their communities for pay equity.

After you have looked at the material, ask 20 contacts to register online and finish the tool as time permits. Think about organizing groups at libraries or community centers to gather and explore the tool. We need everyone's help to train 100,000 women in Work Smart online by August. We have a very generous corporate funder who supported the development of the tool and will be gauging the benefit of their philanthropy by the results of this drive!

Book Collection Progress: As of this writing, we have 406 packed boxes in our locker filled with books of every genre.

**Sign-Up Genius:** This month we have spent a lot of time road-testing *Sign-Up Genius*, our online Book Sale week sign up site. This is a departure from previous years when we have manually entered our work date and time preferences on paper forms. Our first round of testing was with seven AAUW members chosen at random. The second round was with our consulting committee. Feedback from those groups has been overwhelmingly positive. The site is intuitive, user friendly and slick.

Just prior to our April 3 Branch Pot Luck Social each member will receive an *Invitation to Sign Up* email from our administrator, Karen Bondy. You can sign up on your tablet or phone by clicking on the invitation email link. Once you have registered and created a password, you can make your date and time selections. After selections have been made, you can go back in at any time to add, change or delete sessions. You can also input a comment if there is something about your selection that an administrator, the Book Sale Coordinator or Day Captains will need to know. For example: *I need to leave for a half hour at 3:00 pm.* 

In addition to the confirmation email that each member will receive automatically upon completing a sign up, the program has the ability to allow the administrator to send a reminder to **only** those who have **not** yet signed up. In addition, a reminder can be sent to all sign ups a few days before the sale.

#### **Reminders of Upcoming Events:**

• On Friday, March 15, we will have the second of three events, our annual Update the Signs Pizza Party. Our yard signs stand as the single most effective way that our communities learn about our Book Sale-when it is and where it is every year. This year, we need to get the word out effectively that we will hold the sale at a new venue, the First United Methodist Church of Glen Ellyn, which is at the corner of Duane and Forest, just east of the Civic Center. We hope you will join us on March 15 at 9:30 am at Nancy Possinger's home! This has always been a fun time for us to get together and complete this important task.

We still have about 30 yard signs unaccounted for. Please bring them with you on March 15.

On Wednesday, April 3, we will have a special Branch meeting which will be a potluck social at the Glen Ellyn
History Center at 7:00 pm where we will have wine and food and plenty of camaraderie interspersed with
opportunities to sign up to help with the final tasks leading up to our Book Sale. And we will have the
opportunity for you to sign up online that night for the times you would like to help during Book Sale week.

Washington Update: Contact your member of the U. S. House of Representatives to request his/her support for:

- HR 8, a bill that creates universal background checks for gun ownership (see also Illinois SB 337 below).
- **HR 1**, i.e., For the People Act, which restores the Voting Rights Act; modernizes the financing of elections through small donor matching funds; and ends gerrymandering in an attempt to restore transparency in government.
- **HR 7**, i.e., *The Paycheck Fairness Act*, which helps close the gender pay gap. Speaker Pelosi has committed to passing the bill out of the House on April 2, Equal Pay Day.
- (See the AAUW 2017-2019 Biennial Public Policy Action Priorities as the source of advocacy for the recommended legislative action.)

#### **Springfield Update:**

• On Jan. 17 Gov. Pritzker signed **\$B337**, the Gun Dealer Licensing Act/Combating Illegal Firearms Act into law. (AAUW Public Policy: *AAUW recognizes that gun violence is a public health crisis*.)


