Legal Advocacy Fund



The Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF) walk will occur on Saturday, October 26, starting at 9:00 am from the Glen Ellyn Public Library parking lot and ending at Shane's Deli in Wheaton for coffee and treats. This replaces the Eleanor Roosevelt walk.

Donations can be brought to the walk or mailed directly to me and are tax-deductible. You do not need to walk to donate. The LAF offers support against sexual discrimination and harassment in higher education and the workplace. This includes personal support during a trial, community outreach and funding amicus briefs to support a case. Please contact me by email to sign up for the walk.





Five take-aways from Representative Terra Costa Howard's presentation at our September 4 Branch meeting:

- 1. Mental health issues tend to lead to bi-partisan efforts.
- 2. The Reproductive Health Act passed because Democratic women stood together; women controlled the health decision.
- 3. Legislators will acknowledge witness slips but, most likely, refer only to the aggregate submitted, not the content specifics.
- 4. The most effective way to follow a bill is to find out its status from its co-sponsors and the chairs of the legislative committee that will review it. See *ILGA.qov*.
- 5. The most effective way to support or to oppose a bill is to let the co-sponsors, legislative committee chair, and your State Senator and State Representative know your position.
