

Branch Focus Areas



Educational Opportunity Fund

Since its founding in 1961, the Branch's primary fundraising efforts have supported education for women. In Spring 2021, we expect to award Higher Education Incentive Awards to four local high school students who will continue their education at the College of DuPage. We will also support national AAUW's Education and Training Fund which awards fellowships and research grants to women at the graduate and post-graduate level. In the past, our major fundraiser was an annual **Used Book Sale**. Due to coronavirus concerns, there will be no book sale in 2020 or 2021. Other fundraisers will replace that initiative.



LUNAFEST Film Festival

LUNAFEST is a cultural event and fundraiser that features award-winning short films made by, for and about women. The selected films mirror AAUW's mission to promote and empower women. Proceeds from the LUNAFEST fundraiser support the Branch's Educational Opportunities Fund. The next LUNAFEST Film Festival will be virtual and is scheduled for **September 10-11, 2021**.



Special Projects

In Summer 2020, the Branch initiated "**Science Girls on the Go**" to provide parents easy access to at-home science-based projects. Two kiosks, each with a supply of science projects, are available. One is at 1445 Brentwood Lane, Wheaton and the other is at 373 Oak Street, Glen Ellyn. This initiative is one of the Branch's ongoing STEM initiatives, designed to encourage girls to pursue studies in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. In 2021, the Branch hopes to resume its regular **STEM Outreach Workshops** at local libraries which provide youth with hands-on, scientific experiences.
