Congressional District 3:

Delia Ramirez, Democratic Primary Candidate, held a meet and greet on March 27 at the Village of Glen Ellyn Civic Center. She has three opponents for the newly formed Congressional District 3. She is aligned with many AAUW Public Policy Priorities: women's reproductive rights; stricter gun laws as a route to improving public safety; humane immigration reform as a pathway to citizenship; reducing the cost of child care; and insuring long-term care for seniors. She will not take corporate donations as a source of campaign funding. I told her campaign manager, Levi, that many of our AAUW Branch members reside in District 3, so we want to know the dates and times of all District 3 candidate forums. I gave him the AAUW Public Policy Priorities and my contact information.

- Use your yard sign! Take a picture, upload it to Facebook or Instagram with the comment, *Hope to see you at the AAUW Book Sale!*
- Try to use Facebook to reach friends of friends. For example, I plan to tag my daughter in a Facebook post, asking her to share the Book Sale information with her Wheaton & Glen Ellyn friends. Even though she moved away several years ago, she keeps in touch with many former classmates who are still in the area. Remember that despite being technologically savvy, many Millennials still love the smell and feel of a good book.

Do these efforts help? Yes, they do! In 2019 (our last Book Sale year), we received 170 Facebook *likes* within a few days after our first Book Sale Facebook posting. Since the Branch only had 130 members at that time (and less than half are on Facebook), we are definitely reaching an audience beyond our membership. Let us try to increase our *likes* and *shares* this year. We have a lot of books to sell! Our goal is to get more people into the building. Once inside, the books will sell themselves. Have you ever seen a Book Sale customer buy only one book?
