Projects, which are available in three neighborhood locations. These kiosks, modeled on "little libraries", each have a supply of free science projects. In addition, Branch members are sponsoring three **STEM Outreach Workshops** at the Glen Ellyn Public Library this Fall. These after school programs provide students in 2nd through 5th grades with hands-on scientific experiences.
