Science Girls on the Go™



This initiative is designed to encourage the pursuit of studies in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. It provides parents with easy access to **At-home Science-based**

Projects, which are available in three neighborhood locations. These kiosks, modeled on "little libraries", each have a supply of free science projects. They include detailed instructions and all needed materials. Kiosk locations can be found on the Branch website (click the "STEM" link). In addition, Branch members are leading a series of **STEM Outreach Workshops** at the Glen Ellyn Public Library. These after school programs provide students with hands-on scientific experiences.
