The requirement of 20% of the membership met the quorum requirements for a valid election of Branch officers. Sarah Allen, Nominating Committee Chair, introduced the candidates to be nominated for Co-Membership Vice President and Treasurer. The membership was asked for nominations from the floor. The Glenbard High School District 87 referendum that was on the March 19 primary ballot passed by a slim margin. According to an article in the Daily Herald newspaper on April 11, 2004, the ballot measure received 12,491 YES votes (50.82%) and 12,087 NO votes, a difference of only 404 votes. The district plans to borrow \$183 million by issuing bonds for building repairs and improvements at all four Glenbard High Schools. Plans include upgrading safety and security; improving classrooms; repairing and renovating building infrastructure; and eliminating overcrowded conditions. Bonds will be issued between spring 2025 and 2027. Planned projects vary by high school based on building age and condition.

Break Our Own Barrier: Open Up AAUW!

We are approaching a monumental decision. This April and May, we will have the opportunity to vote to open AAUW to those who do not hold degrees. We encourage you to vote *YES* on dropping the degree mandate. Voting *YES* is practicing the inclusion we as AAUW members believe. AAUW's National Board of Directors, Governance Committee, Advancement Committee, Inclusion and Equity Committee and our Illinois State Board of Directors all support this change.

Removing the degree requirement is not meant to take anything away from current member accomplishments or AAUW's commitment to education. Our endowment of well over a \$100 million will continue to grow and award fellowships and grants in increasing amounts each year (\$6.1 million last year). AAUW's membership requirements have changed many times over our long history to become more inclusive. This next step is a way to celebrate all that makes us extraordinary with a larger pool of driven individuals. Treating each other fairly, with respect and compassion, is the foundation of AAUW and serves as the catalyst of our current and future efforts.

What is our biggest challenge to breaking our own barrier? You may be surprised to learn that we believe it is voter turnout. While this is not the first time we have voted on this, we have never had more than 25% of our membership actually cast a vote. In 2021, a clear majority of those voting were in favor of the change (63%), but it takes a 2/3 vote to change a bylaw and we fell short of that bar.

Please vote and let us finally open up AAUW. There is so much work to do to accomplish our goals. Let us welcome all who share our values and believe in our mission to stand with us!

Sign-Up Genius will be emailed in mid-May for you to sign up for sorting times. We only have six sorting days so we will need lots of help on those days.

- Book Sale Collection Sites will be open the month of May at Health Track, Wheaton Sport Center, Sunset Knoll Rec Center, Main Street Rec Center, and Spring Avenue Rec Center. There will be a collection bin at Westfield Elementary School from June 3 until June 14.
- Go for a Walk on a Spring Afternoon...Lilac Parade participants needed: Karla Bullett has submitted our Branch's name to participate in Lombard's Lilac Parade on Sunday, May 19. This is a great opportunity to increase the visibility of our Branch and our Used Book Sale. Our participation would be similar to what we have done in the past for the Glen Ellyn Independence Day parade, walk the parade route while we carry signs advertising the collection sites and sale details. Here's a Tip: Don't overlook the discounts and perks available from your AAUW membership. Just go to *aauw.org* and search for discounts. Among other things, you will find up to 50% savings on UPS shipping costs and a 35% discount on Avis or Budget Car Rentals.

Now, let us look ahead to the Book Sale. The Branch Online team will be busy in May and June supporting the upcoming Book Sale.

- Cannot remember the dates and locations for donating books? The Branch website features all you need to know. Two flyers are available on the website for you to click and print. One focuses on the Sale and the other on Book Donations. Keep some in your car in case you spot a community bulletin board that needs a flyer or a garage/estate sale that may need to dispose of unsold books.
- Spread the word: Anyone who googles *Wheaton AAUW* or *Glen Ellyn AAUW* will go directly to *wheatonglenellyn-il.aauw.net*. The dates and locations for pre-sale book donations and for the Book Sale are prominently featured on the home page.
- When you see one of our Facebook posts, keep the buzz going with a Like or Share or with a Comment, such as, I'll be there or Can't wait! or Time to buy my beach books! Better yet, post a picture of some books on your own Facebook page (along with an attention-getter like your dog or cat or grandchild), share it with your friends and to the AAUW Used Book Sale page.
- We used to send postcards to former Book Sale customers. This year we will send two or three email blasts to our friends from our prior Book Sales. This year, will also include emails to friends of past Lombard Book Sales.

Closer to the Book Sale dates, we will ask members to help in other ways.

- Please send an email to your friends and neighbors with the details of the sale by attaching a Book Sale flyer that you can download from the website. Don't forget to mention: proceeds primarily fund local scholarships.
- Use your yard sign! Take a picture, upload it to Facebook or Instagram with the comment, Hope to see you at the AAUW Used Book Sale.
- Try to use Facebook to reach friends of friends. For example, I plan to tag my daughter in a Facebook post, asking her to share the Book Sale information with her Wheaton friends. Even though she moved away several years ago, she is Friends with many former classmates who are still in the area. Remember that despite being technologically savvy, many Millennials still love the smell and feel of a good book.
- Are you in a neighborhood *Facebook* Group or *Next Door* neighborhood group? In May, ask the group for book donations and in June, publicize the sale dates.

Do these efforts help? Yes, they do! Currently, we have 224 followers of our *Book Sale Facebook* page and 289 followers of our Branch page. Since the Branch only has 118 members (and not all are on *Facebook*), we are definitely reaching an audience beyond our membership. Let us try to increase our likes and shares this year. We have a lot of books to sell! Our goal is to get more people into the building. Once inside, the books will sell themselves. Have you ever seen a Book Sale customer buy only one book?







