Branch documents are available, such as, Bylaws, Policy Handbook, Board and Branch Meeting Minutes, Financial Reports and the Illinois State Tax Exemption Letter. Also, thanks to the hard work of the Aging Information Resources (AIR) Study Group, there are now lists of resources and service providers personally recommended by the Study Group.

Annual Updates: Every year in August, we review each page of the website to make sure its information stays current. For example, the reading lists for our four book groups are now up to date. You can help by letting us know if you spot anything that needs to be updated.

Social Media: We have two Facebook pages, the Book Sale page and the Branch page. The Book Sale page is active during our Book Sale donation drive and the Book Sale. The Branch page is active all year round. We publicize our Branch Meeting programs, Science Girls on the Go<sup>™</sup> and other Branch activities. We also share updates received from national AAUW. You all have done a great job with your Facebook likes comments and shares. Keep it up!

The Paris 2024 Olympics have shown the positive effects of Title IX and other efforts to achieve equity for women. Out of 10,500 athletes, 5,250 are women and 5, 250 are men. This is the first time there has been full gender parity at the Olympics games.

Need help with unexpected basement flood? Your garage door has malfunctioned? You need to install a ramp? Car trouble? Computer repair? There are about thirty services listed under *Home Services Providers* along with the name of the branch member who recommended it.

The **Health and Care Resources** lists more than 30 medical services from knee replacements to Parkinson's clinics as well as primary care providers. There are a total of five on-line lists which include **Transportation**, **Housing Information and End-of-Life issues**. Our Branch AIR Study Group compiled this resource to provide a service to the Branch as we inform each other about salient issues dealing with aging.
