- Two theaters, with the possibility of a third will be available. 240 tickets will be printed.
- Manhattan Short Film Festival splits 50% of Net Revenue with the branch. We are allowed to figure in Theater Rental and Marquee Rental as costs against Revenue to determine Net Revenue. The Glen Arts Theater only gets their rental fees and whatever is made from the concessions.
- Posters, flyers, and voting cards will be provided.
- Tickets will be available for sale at the May 31 luncheon.

- Registration and fee of \$175 for the Lombard Craft Fair has been made.
- Set-up for the fair starts at 7:30am. The fair ends at 4pm.
- 17 volunteers are donating time to work at the craft fair in shifts of two hours.
